TOURISM

A number of tourism infrastructure projects have been worked on during the summer:

- Selkirk Saddle Club covered riding facility completion
- major renovations at the Revelstoke Museum and Archives
- runway expansion at the Revelstoke Airport
- new trails at the Revy Riders Dirt Bike track facility on Westside Road
- new directional signage to attract visitors to Revelstoke
- sidewalk and bike trail improvements along Nichol Road
- downtown streetscape enhancement adjacent to City Hall.

Resort Municipality Initiative funds will also be invested this fall in new grooming equipment to assist the Revelstoke Snowmobile Club to maintain the high quality trail system and the Nordic Ski Club to develop lighted trails at Mt MacPherson.

Most of these projects could not have been completed without the support and hard work of the many volunteer clubs and groups in the community which contribute significantly to the development and maintenance of tourism infrastructure in Revelstoke.

OPEN FOR BUSINESS AWARD

Revelstoke was shortlisted as a finalist by the Small Business Roundtable of BC for an Open for Business Award. An application was prepared and submitted which recognizes the work that the City and other community agencies are doing to help create a more business-friendly environment in the community. For many years, the City has provided financial support to the Chamber of Commerce, which has worked hard to promote the interests of the local business community. Community Connections has been involved in several initiatives to assist residents with disabilities to participate in the workplace, and Okanagan College has delivered a number of programs to assist youth, older workers and others develop the skills they need to find employment. The City continues its efforts to reduce taxes for business and to improve development and application processes at City Hall. The Open for Business Award nomination takes all these activities into account.

LABOUR MARKET STRATEGY

The CED Department is initiating a Labour Market Strategy this fall. The Department has heard from the business community about the challenges they are facing to find and retain employees. The labour market situation will become more challenging over the next few years as a large number of workers enter their retirement years. The purpose of the Labour Market Strategy is to engage local businesses and industry to find out exactly what their current labour needs are and what their needs will be in the future. A concrete plan of action will be prepared to help address these issues, including attracting and training new workers. The Steering Committee for the Project is the Community Labour Market Network, a group of local business leaders, the Chamber of Commerce, Okanagan College and the Director of CED, established by the WorkBC - Revelstoke Employment Centre. The majority of the funding for this project has been secured through a grant from the Province of BC.

BIOENEGY PROJECT

The CED Department has been working with the Revelstoke Community Forest Corporation, Revelstoke Community Energy Corporation and Downie Timber to explore opportunities to make better use of waste wood in the community. The City issued a request for Expressions of Interest for projects that might make use of the wood waste in Revelstoke with the goals of adding value and creating employment. Over 50 Expressions of Interest were submitted, and the City has requested some firm proposals from the interested parties on how they would utilize the waste wood. We hope to evaluate these proposals this fall. Obtaining more value from wood waste in Revelstoke has been a long-term economic development goal for the community.

CONNECTING NEWCOMERS AND THE COMMUNITY

Welcome Week is Revelstoke putting our best foot forward. It's a week of free or low cost events, coupled with a spirit of celebration. It's an opportunity to share community spirit and inspire all newcomers – seasonal or otherwise – to get involved, to showcase the town, businesses, events, facilities, and services. The third annual Welcome Week will take place November 22nd to 29th, and includes the annual Volunteer Fair 3 pm Wednesday, November 26th at the Community Centre.

ADDRESSING PROBLEM SUBSTANCE USE

Since the *Revelstoke Community Substance Use Strategy* was released in 2010, our focus has been on the Youth Initiative and strengthening positive support for youth in our community. To provide a deeper level of support, in March of 2012 the Youth Mental Health and Substance Use Committee was formed – a group of service providers dedicated to supporting youth in partnership with Revelstoke Secondary School. Last year for the first time since 2009, we administered the Youth Drug Survey at RSS. The survey covers a wide range of topics from personal substance use to how much RSS students know or have experienced about harms related to drugs and alcohol. Over 85% of students completed the survey. The Youth Drug Survey Final Report compares the 2009 & 2013 results. In 2013, we found that binge drinking, as well as regular use of tobacco and marijuana, has declined since 2009.

POVERTY REDUCTION

Following the release of the *Revelstoke Community Poverty Reduction Strategy* in 2012, 'improved information sharing, networking and communication on poverty reduction goals and strategies' has been an important community goal. In April, we were invited to Nelson to share our experience in developing a poverty reduction strategy. In May, presentations were made to our local Chamber and Rotary Club. In September, Revelstoke was invited to present alongside the Cities of Surrey and Victoria at a workshop on "Tackling Poverty at the Community Level" at the annual Union of BC Municipalities convention in Whistler.

The Poverty Reduction Working Group is growing. Among other things, the working group's purpose is to act as a 'think tank', brainstorming ideas and building community partnerships to act on those ideas, track progress, and measure, evaluate and report on outcomes. This fall, watch for newspaper articles in the Times Review describing the many poverty reduction efforts going on in Revelstoke.



The Social Development Committee is an Advisory Committee to Revelstoke City Council. The Committee provides input to the work plan of the Social Development Coordinator, Jill Zacharias, who is contracted to the City of Revelstoke and reports to the Director of Community Economic Development.

Jill works to address community-wide social issues through planning and bringing together community partners to work on related strategies and projects. Jill also supports social sector organizations and non-profits in Revelstoke by bringing in training opportunities, helping out with grant writing, and connecting groups with potential resources. Since 2008, \$377,000 has been brought in to support 25 different social projects in the community.

AFFORDABLE HOUSING

The provision of affordable housing in Revelstoke has been identified as a high community priority for several years.



The Revelstoke Community Housing Society announced that the start of construction of the affordable rental housing project on Oscar Street has been delayed until the spring of 2015. The Chair of the Society, Mark McKee stated: "The members of the Society are disappointed that there is a delay in getting this important community project underway. The Society and their consulting team have worked hard to move the project forward, but there are still some issues that need to be resolved, and we are getting too close to winter to begin construction."

This project will deliver 12 townhouse units that will be rented at affordable rates to meet the needs of people in the community. The Society has received funding from BC Housing and CBT to assist with the construction of the units, and the City of Revelstoke has agreed to lease land on Oscar Street to the Society. The Society hopes to be able to start renting the units later in 2015.
