

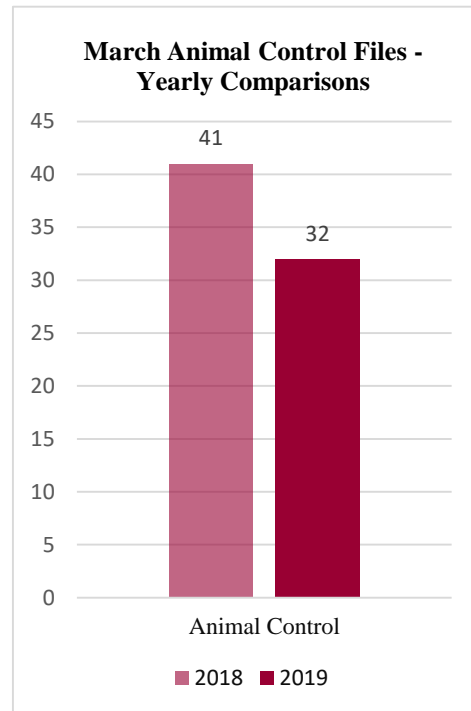
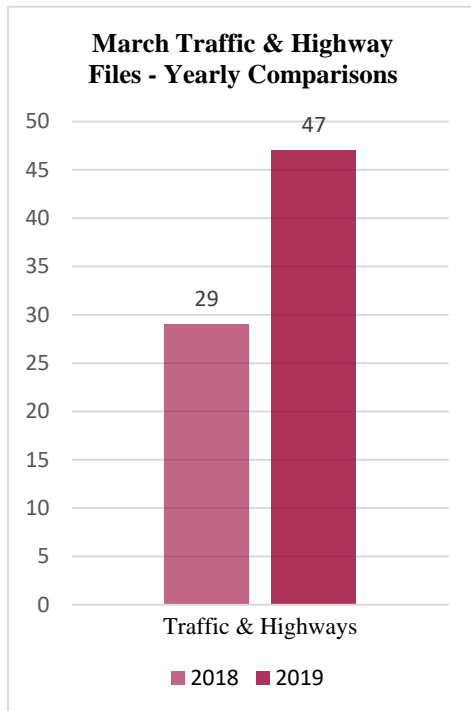

Dogs Impounded/Returned This Month:

- Bylaw Enforcement impounded and reunited one dog with its owner.

March Bylaw of the Month – Animal Control Bylaw No. 2183.

- The focus of this month was education, with emphasis on animals at large (not leashed), barking dogs, and valid licensing for dogs.
- We also included focus on the spring time issues such as cleaning up after your dog.
- Links are included for the Animal Control Bylaw, off leash map, pet awareness brochure, dog license application and backyard chickens.

Additional Notes:

- There were 6 dog bite/attacks for the month of March and 14 Aggressive/Dangerous dog calls for the 2019 year to date. These files require considerable time for investigation and follow-up. Bylaw Enforcement continues to educate the public on care and control of dogs.
- Bylaw Enforcement has been operating with reduced resources for the month of March. The Administration Department assisted with complaints, followed up and closed files, monitored SeeClickFix requests, and ensured files were updated.
