

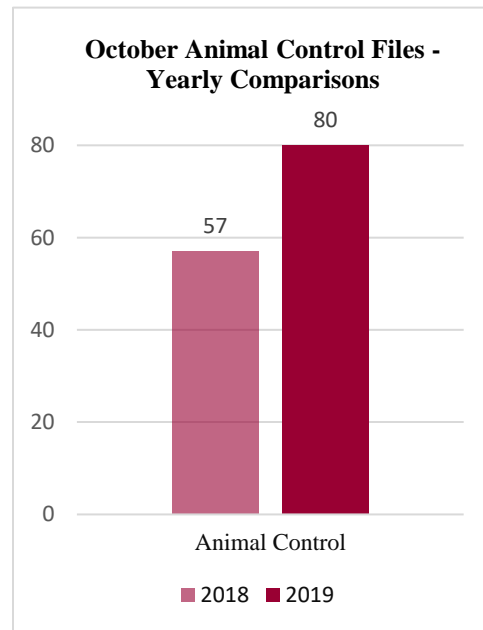
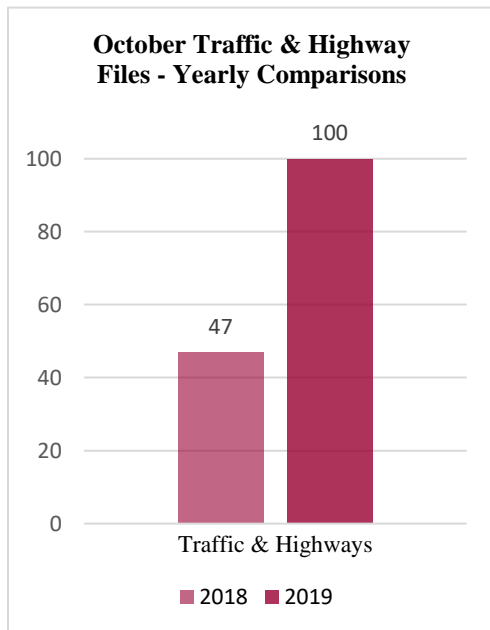

Animal Control Impounds & Returns:

- Bylaw Enforcement impounded 2 dogs this month.
- Both animals were reunited with their owners with tickets issued for dog at large and no dog license.

October Bylaw of the Month – [Animal Control Bylaw No. 2183](#) Animal Control Compliance Campaign

- In conjunction with the Bylaw of the Month, Bylaw Officers initiated an Animal Control Compliance Campaign to educate the public on the rules around dog ownership in Revelstoke.
- The campaign focused on animal control issues such as dogs off leash, the requirement for dog licenses, picking up after your animals and provided information on officer safety when exercising their authority while on duty.
- Relevant information was posted on social media platforms including multiple Facebook posts weekly, Instagram posts, three alternating radio advertisements and a discussion on the Mayor's weekly Radio Show.
- A [Frequently Asked Questions](#) section was published on the website to answer inquiries that arose during the campaign.
- Bylaw Officers deemed the campaign a success, seeing an increase in on-leash compliance and a decrease in complaints throughout the month. Many dog owners also obtained licenses to ensure the safety of their pets.
