



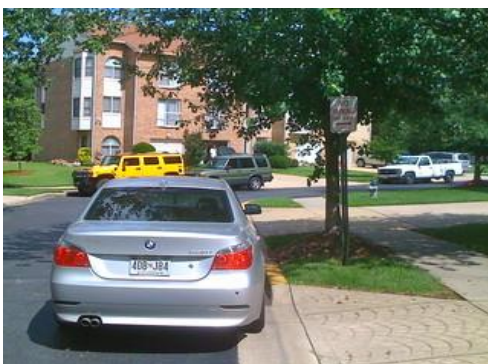

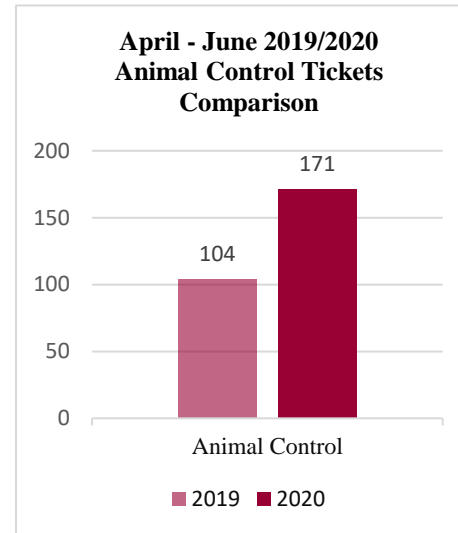
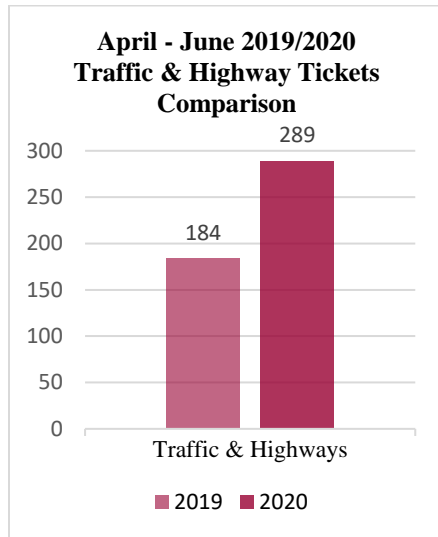

April - June 2020 Quarterly Summary



Animal Control

- 16 Dangerous/Aggressive dog investigations for this quarter.
- 28 Dangerous/Aggressive dog investigations for the year to date.
- 1 dog impounded in April. Reunited with owner.
- Dangerous/Aggressive dog investigations include attacks or bites on both domestic animals and people.

Additional Notes:

- Traffic & Highway offences increased by over 50% compared to the same quarter last year.
- Animal Control offences also increased by over 50% compared to the second quarter of 2019.
- Both Traffic & Highway and Animal Control offences increased steadily over the course of April, May, and June.
- There was a sharp decline in tickets issued this quarter, 38 compared to 228 last quarter. This decrease can be attributed to Covid-19.
- 8 tow requests this quarter and 45 requests for the year to date.
- In April and May, Covid-19 related issues include 210 pro-active patrols, 137 calls and 211 trespass incidents in public parks, resulting in the removal of the trespassers from the parks. Bylaw officers focused on education, not enforcement.
- Given the wet and cool conditions this spring, watering infractions decreased significantly.
- \$4850 in fines were issued this quarter.
